

Public Speaking Practicum

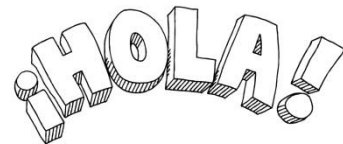

Introduction to Spanish

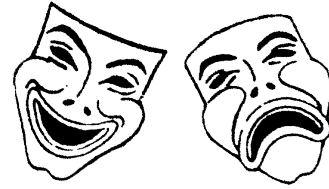

Who/Level: Rising Classes One-Five (Boys and Girls), Classes Six-Eight (Boys)

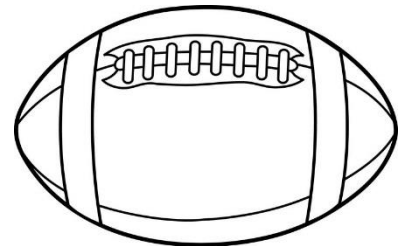
